




Community Bands of Blacksburg: Then and Now

The Blacksburg Cornet Band, 1876 and The Glade Cornet Band, 1882

Community bands have been part of the fabric of community life in the US since the early 1800s. At that time all music was live music, and local non-professional bands were popular at holiday and patriotic gatherings, especially outdoor events. These bands were composed generally of ten to twenty brass and percussion instruments and were similar to British colliery brass bands in instrumentation and music.

In 1876, Blacksburg had its own Blacksburg Cornet Band and later The Glade Cornet Band in 1882. Formed by local citizens, the band played for community events and the Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, a predecessor to Virginia Tech.

In the early 1900s, school bands became an important part of public education, which contributed to the development of community bands. These concert bands grew in number and evolved into full concert wind ensembles of up to 100 members. Today there are about 2,500 nonprofessional community concert bands in the US, providing an outlet for amateur musicians to continue their love of music after graduation. As was the case in the 1800s, these bands are part of the fabric of their communities, offering public concerts and performing at civic events.


